District-Level Workshop Successfully Organized, Focus on Natural Farming Practices

Aurangabad, Bihar

Date: March 28, 2026

A district-level workshop was successfully organized by PRAN on March 28, 2026, in Aurangabad district. Around 50 farmers participated in the workshop. Officials including Block Horticulture Officers (BHO), representatives from ATMA, and scientists from IRISST were also present.

During the workshop, farmers were provided with detailed insights into natural farming and organic alternatives. On this occasion, Chandni Devi, a progressive farmer from Rafiganj block, shared her experience of replacing chemical fertilizer urea with “Shri Jeevamrit.” She explained that it is prepared using cow dung, cow urine, jaggery, gram flour, and soil microorganisms, kept in a shaded place for 72 hours. It is then applied during irrigation as an alternative to urea, resulting in increased yield and reduced input cost.

Similarly, farmer Sangeeta Devi shared her knowledge on pest management using “Shri Neemastra.” She highlighted that this natural method is effective in protecting crops and is environmentally sustainable.

Pushpa Devi, a farmer from Karma Bhagwan area of Aurangabad, shared her experience in mushroom cultivation and value-added products. She emphasized that mushroom farming can serve as a reliable source of additional income for farmers.

At the end of the workshop, participating farmers appreciated the initiative taken by PRAN and expressed a positive inclination towards adopting natural farming practices.
